As summer approaches there is optimism in the beef industry. The bull sales were generally strong despite lower cow numbers. With a little help from mother nature in the form of timely rain we can expect a strong market through this year for cattle of all types. The Hereford breed is well positioned for when the cow herd rebuilds but as an association we want to be prepared and ensure our breeders have the digital management tools and value-added programs that align with what the industry will be looking for over the next 5-10 years. The Better Your Beef Strategy laid the groundwork and will continue to guide the Association forward.

The CHA continues its path of modernization to meet the needs of the beef industry of today and tomorrow. The board of directors approved the development of a new Hereford registry/database system that will be released in 2024. This will transform how the association. membership. and commercial producers' interface. It will provide Hereford breeders with new digital tools that will allow them to utilize on farm data in new ways. We also recognize that Hereford breeders are diverse in how they operate and have different needs. This program is flexible in its functionality and is mobile friendly so your information will be close by 365 days a year. The CHA continues to focus on achieving the goals outlined in the Better Your Beef strategy. 'Must Win Battle 2' states that Hereford be a maternal ingredient for productive crossbreeding programs. Through collaboration and cooperation with industry partners we can add value to Hereford cattle through opportunities that we couldn't do alone. This includes aligning with other breed associations, service providers, and others. A Hereford Baldy program focused on the commercial cattle sector that will use genomic technology to assist in the development and selection of high-quality Herefordcross commercial heifers. This initiative received funding from RDAR (Results Driven Agriculture Research - an Alberta based funding organization) for a total project value of \$3.8 million. The project is underway and new programs are being developed and will be released later this year.

As you may have noticed, there have been recent changes to the online animal inquiry. The CHA now displays a 'Potential' or 'P' designation in the pedigree for the six known genetic conditions affecting the Hereford breed in Canada. This is based on pedigree analysis and highlights the importance of accurate pedigrees in our Herdbook. These conditions are all recessive and the Potential designation can be removed through genetic testing the individual animal or by testing an ancestral animal further back in their pedigree. As more testing is completed statuses will change. Using the recently identified Delayed Blindness genetic condition, an individual animal can be DBF (Delayed Blindness Free), DBC (Delayed Blindness Carrier) or DBP (Delayed Blindness Potential). The CHA will not be revoking registration certificates based on the genetic condition status but provides the service so breeders can easily identify the status of an animal and avoid unintentionally breeding two carriers together or know which animals to test without researching multiple pedigree generations. Testing must be done through the CHA and our official service provider Neogen.

Bonanza will be hosted in Brandon, Manitoba from July 23-27, 2024. There will be juniors from a variety of backgrounds and ages competing. With the central location we are anticipating a large turnout of animal entries and kids attending from coast to coast. The Bonanza open show is a recognized MOE Show and points accumulated will go toward the new CHA Show Animal of the Year awards. The CHA Annual General Meeting will be held in conjunction with Bonanza and will take place in the evening of July 26, 2024. I look forward to seeing you there.
